

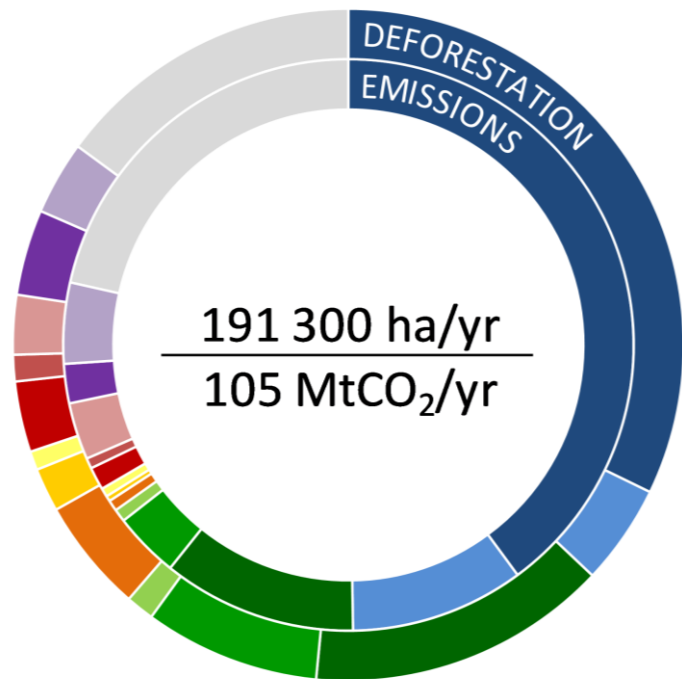

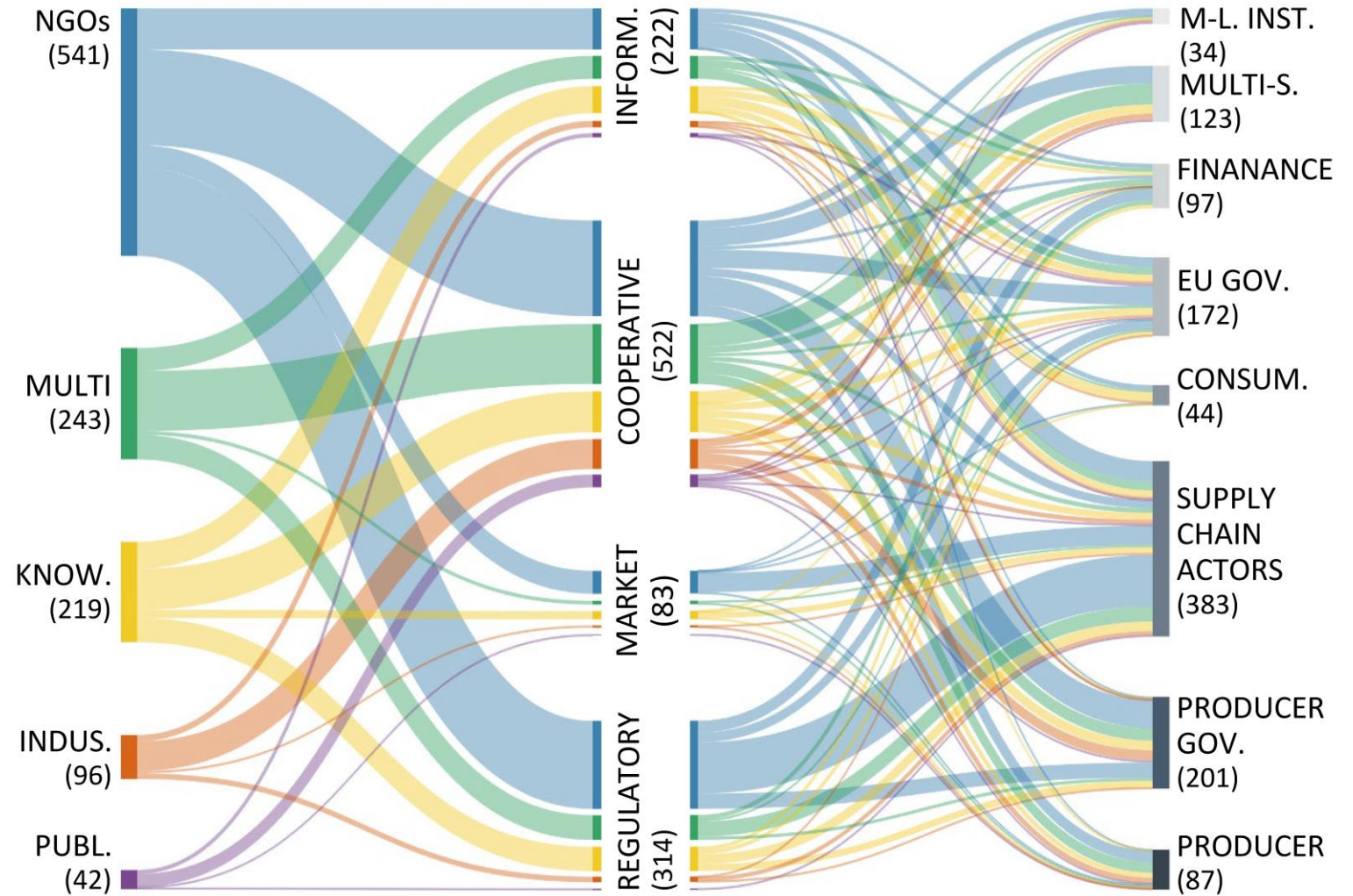
RESEARCH QUESTIONS

RESULTS

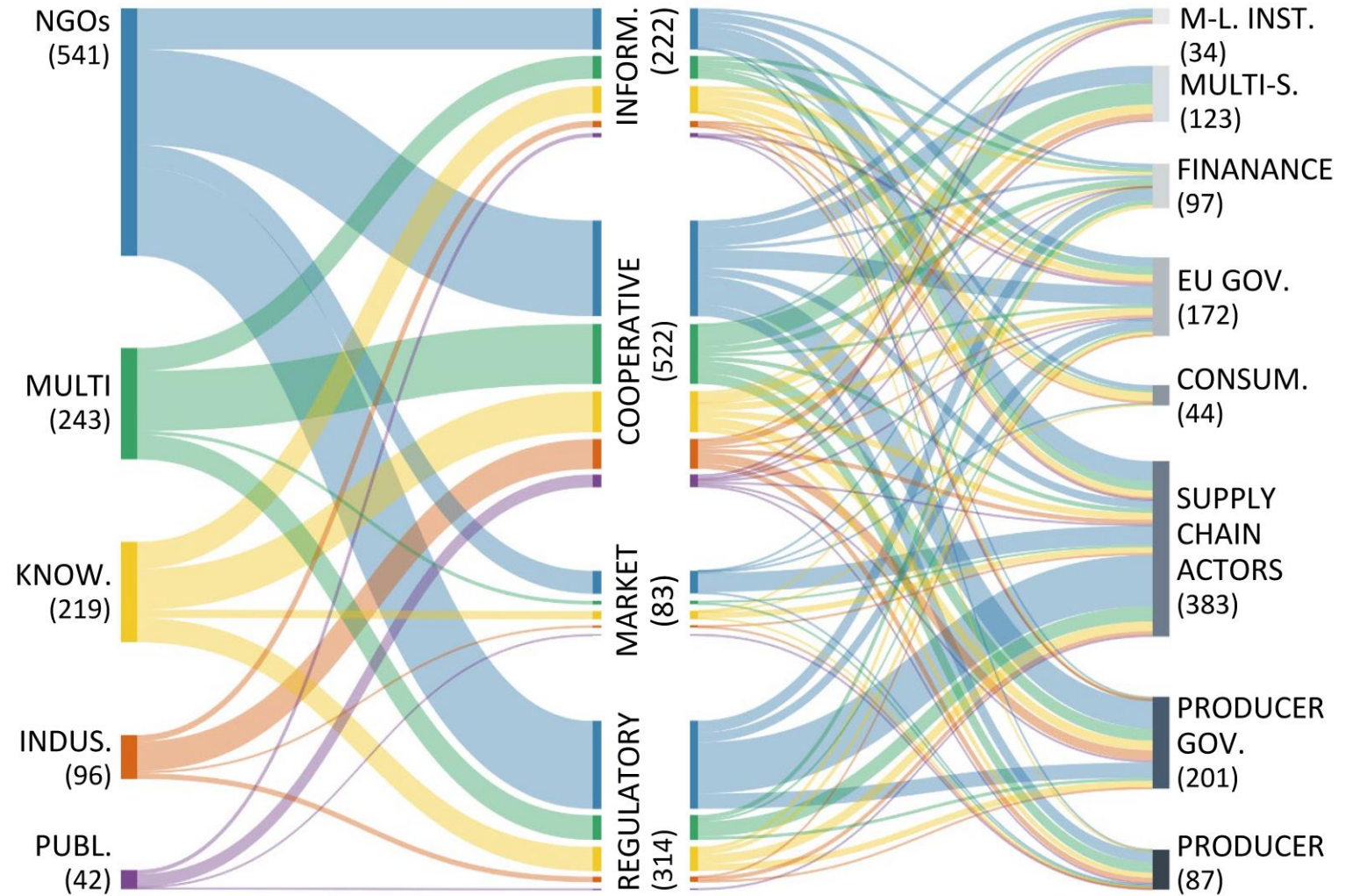
Soft policy instruments (informative & cooperative) dominate over hard (market-based & regulatory), though this differ by proponent types...



MULTI = multi-stakeholder groups, KNOW = knowledge institutions, INDUS = industry actors, and PUBL = public organizations, MULTI-S = multi-stakeholder groups, M-L INST = multilateral institutions

RESULTS

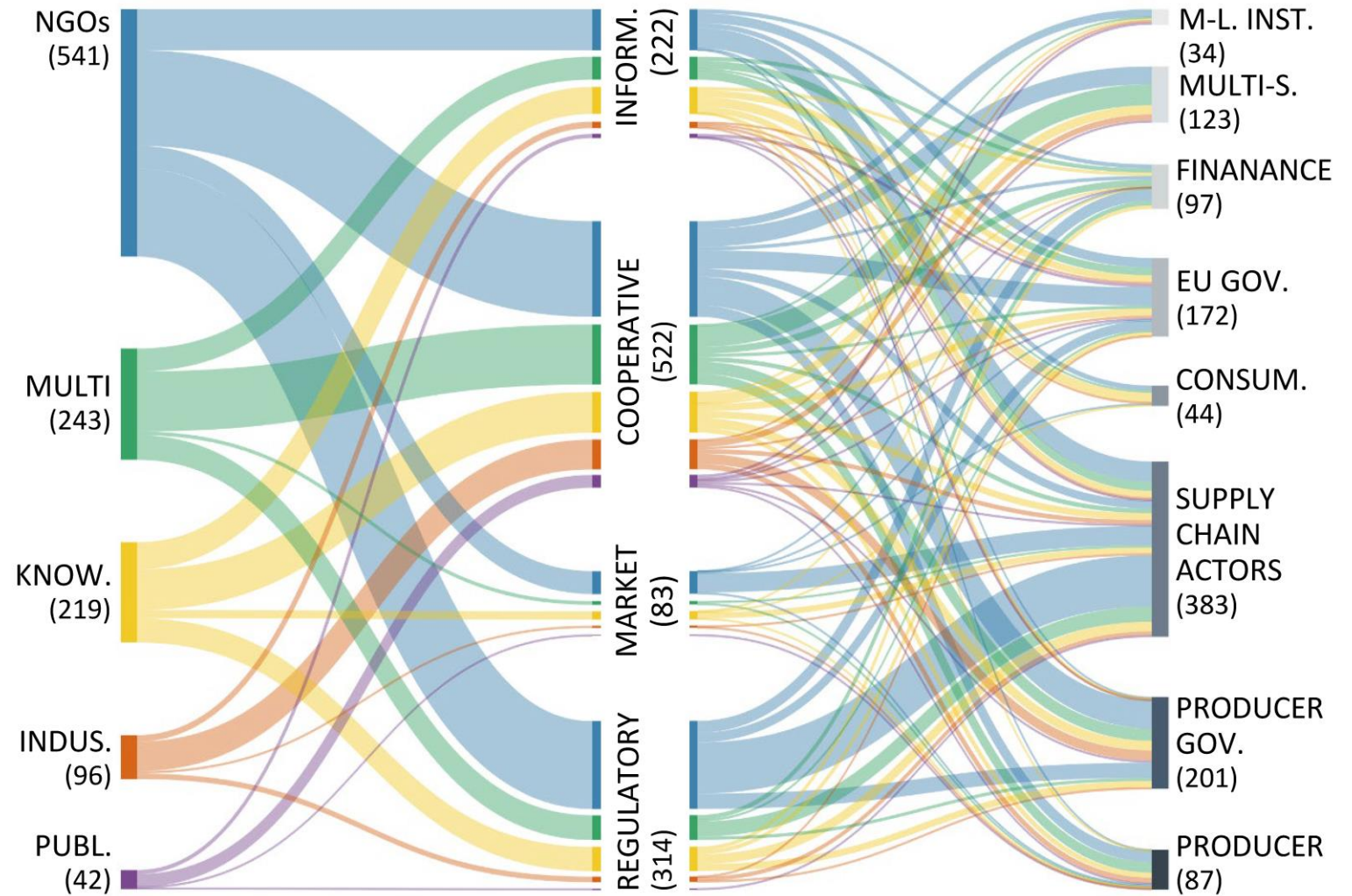
Trade-off between informational & cooperative policies with high feasibility, but weak theories of change (TOCs) and regulatory policies with low feasibility, but stronger TOCs...
